



LILLA MAE HANDLEY TODD GLASS

Lilla Mae Handley Todd Glass, 96, entered into the Full Presence of her Lord and Savior, Jesus, on Christmas Morning, 2020 after a long struggle with Alzheimer's.

Lilla Mae was born in the Rock Creek community, located in western Jefferson County, on July 16, 1924 to parents Alta Hogan Handley and Wilson Handley. She was the fourth child in a family of six children that grew up on a self-sufficient farm weathering the Great Depression with hard toil, endless chores, but amazing sense of family union and loyalty.

She professed Christ at an early age and was baptized at Union Hill Baptist Church, Rock Creek. She remained a faithful and participating member of Union Hill, as long as her health allowed, for the rest of her life.

For most of Lilla Mae's life, she was a housewife with numerous and continuous projects that kept her "busy as a bee" every day. Everyone was welcomed at her home with a table-full of food, many cups of coffee, ice cream, good laughs, card playing every Friday night, quilting bees, and entertaining stories of her ballroom dancing. Despite many set-backs in life, she was an inspiration to all for her optimism, continuous energy, strong Christian faith, and home-spun wisdom.

Lilla Mae Glass was preceded in death by her first husband, Huston Loyd Richardson, who was killed on Okinawa as a U. S. Marine during World War II; her second husband of 25 years, Charles D. Todd; and by her devoted husband Gene Weaver. She was also preceded in death by her beloved

parents, Alta and Wilson Handley; all of her siblings; her two sons, Rex A. Todd in 1990 and Hugh Wayne Richardson in 2017.

She is survived by her devoted son and caregiver, Charles M. Todd; 6 grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; and 1 great-great grandchild.

The funeral service will be Tuesday, December 29, 2020, at 11:00 AM, at Union Hill Baptist Church, with Rev. Mike Stevens officiating. Burial will follow at Rock Creek Church of God Cemetery.
