



LOWELL WILLIAM "TATER" WALLACE

Lowell William "Tater" Wallace, age 99 of Hueytown, Alabama, passed away December 3, 2017. Lowell worked in various construction jobs, including on the Panama Canal, before he enlisted in the US Navy at the start of World War II. He was proud of his work with the seabees in the Pacific Theater, after the war. He married Marjorie and continued to work in construction, eventually retiring from U.S. Steel. Tater was very active in the bluegrass community, including singing and playing guitar with the house band at the Tannehill Opry. He was very active in church and his community. As a Lions Club member, he spent countless hours getting petitions signed to get Hueytown incorporated. Lowell was preceded in death by his parents, Fred and Pearl Wallace, two brothers Claude and Oscar, and his beloved granddaughter Penny McDonald Stanford. He is survived by his wife of 71 years Marjorie Deaett Wallace; daughters Diane McDonald (Carl), Peggy Burdette, and Dorothy Hurt (Jeff); four grandchildren Patty Geter, Pam McDonald, Jeff, and Scott Burdette, eleven great grandchildren and a host of wonderful friends.
