Mary Lowrey Hall, of Concord, Alabama, passed away on Thursday, October 30, 2025, at the Baptist Reynolds Hospice House in Memphis, Tennessee, at the age of 88. A devoted wife, mother, and friend, Mary dedicated her life to her family and to serving others. She especially cherished her membership at Concord Baptist Church, where she found joy in its grief ministry, weekly family outreach, and in sharing her love of music as a choir member and soloist.

Born in Woodstock, Alabama, Mary was the youngest of four children of the late Audrey Dailey Lowrey and John Parker “J.P.” Lowrey. At age 14, she and her family moved to Hueytown, Alabama, where she faithfully attended Concord Baptist Church and graduated from Hueytown High School in 1955. Mary married the late Clarence Dossie “C.D.” Beasley Jr. and began a long and notable career with Alabama Power Company, where she served for 36 years in various roles, including Manager of the Customer Service Center, Manager of Customer Accounting, and Director of Employee Training.

In addition to camping with their close friends, their favorite adventure was to visit Alaska and the Yukon Territory of Canada. Mary and

She is also survived by her brother Milford E.
