



MAURICE EDWARD "ED" WAITS

November 3, 1932 - April 25, 2026

Maurice Edward "Ed" Waits, age 93, passed away at home on April 25, 2026. Ed attended West End High School and UAB. He subsequently enlisted in the United States Navy and served on the battleship USS New Jersey during the Korean Conflict from 1951 to 1955, then joined the United States Naval Reserve.

Ed was a member of Hueytown Baptist Church where he was ultimately ordained as a Deacon.

In 1958, Ed pioneered the Inhalation Therapy Department for West End Baptist Hospital, now known as Respiratory Care at Baptist Health System-Princeton. As a lone therapist, for three and 1/2 years, he was transported to Highland Avenue Baptist by laundry truck to provide respiratory care there. The "Ed Waits Respiratory Care Conference" was established in his honor and held each year. A commendation was entered into the congressional record on June 17, 2017, by Rep. Robert Aderholt acknowledging his outstanding service to his community, his state, and our country. An Alabama Interim Resolution was entered on June 17, 2017, for his exceptional abilities and dedication to his profession. He was endowed with a Doctor of Humane Letters on May 20, 2018. He had the distinction of being the first President of the Alabama Society of Inhalation Therapy Technicians.

Ed was an avid outdoor enthusiast enjoying his deer hunting, fishing, and golfing with his many friends.

Ed was born November 3, 1932, to Marvin Lovejoy Waits, Sr. and Frances Middleton Waits, in Birmingham where he made his home. He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, and four sisters.

Ed is survived by his wife, Flora Ingram-Waits; three nieces, Kellye Loggins (Steve), Gwen Aaron (Tommy), Carol Reynolds (Stanley); four nephews, Greg Bailey (Debbie), Stanley Waits (Gayle), Carl Meadows, Jr. and David Conwell (Debbie).

The visitation will be Thursday, April 30, 2026, from 9:30 AM until 10:30 AM at Peoples Chapel Funeral Home. The funeral will be at 10:30 AM at the funeral home, with Rev. Joel Frederick officiating. Burial will follow at Alabama National Cemetery at 12:30 PM.
