Richard Snow Fix (February 20, 1927 – April 14, 2024)

Richard “Dick” Snow Fix passed away at 97 years old on April 14, 2024, in the presence of family. He was born in Shelby County, AL in 1927 to Cynthia and Robert Fix and had seven siblings. He joined the Navy in 1945 as a Seaman First Class on USS Haynesworth in World War II. Upon Honorable Discharge, Richard began working as an electrician at US Steel until his retirement.

After retirement, Richard found several hobbies to fill his time. Whether he was playing a round of golf or watching a tournament on tv, golf was a pastime he thoroughly enjoyed. Richard was also an accomplished woodworker; he made items from necklaces, to paper towel holders, to Christmas decorations. After he put the items together, his wife would paint them and give the finished pieces to friends and family. Richard was also a baker, making delicious pound cakes and candy—sharing these items too with friends and family. He never met a stranger and could carry on with anyone. He exuded kindness in his life, evidenced by his life-long friendships and by the relationships he formed along the way with everyone he met.

Richard was preceded in death by his loving wife of 72 years, Jo Anne Fix, their three children—Connie Smith, Debbie Tubbs, and Richard Fix, Jr.—, and his siblings—Joy, Robert, Dorthy, Paul, Lois, and Joanne. He is survived by his grandchildren, Peter W. Smith, Jr. (Amy) and Randi T. Northcutt (Brad) and his sister, Gloria Fix Davis.

Visitation for Richard will take place from 1:00-2:00pm on Wednesday, April 17th at Peoples Chapel Funeral Home in Hueytown, AL. 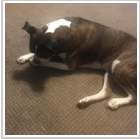
