William Joseph "Joe" Moses Jr., 70, of Hueytown, Ala., passed away peacefully Sunday, July 26, 2020, at home. He was surrounded by his family, who loved him more than words can express.

He was born Aug. 22, 1949, and graduated from Hueytown High School in 1968. He married the former Donna Murphree in 1970, and they had three children, five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He earned an associate's degree from Bessemer State Technical College and retired from U.S. Steel after more than 30 years. He was a lifelong member of First United Methodist Church Hueytown, where he served on a host of boards and committees throughout the years. The church's annual Red Bird Mission Trip to Beverly, Ky., was a highlight of his year, and Camp Sumatanga – where he met his beautiful future bride on a youth retreat in high school – always held a special place in his heart. He was a longtime supporter of Boy Scout Troop 322, a member of Hueytown Lion's Club, a gifted carpenter, an avid Alabama football fan and a classic automobile enthusiast.

He was preceded in death by his parents, William Joseph "Billy" Moses Sr. and Julia Cost Moses. He is survived by his wife of 50 years, Donna Murphree Moses; three children: Lori Moses Brasher (Paul), Kelli Moses Dugan (Eldon) and Joseph Ryan Moses (Keena); one sister, Carol Moses Japp (Joe); two brothers, Alan Moses and Mark Moses (Mary Beth); two brothers-in-law:
